The David Hay Scholarship

A Lasting Legacy

In 1959 David Hay quit school at the age of 15 to work for a transport company. The Brisbane teenager was determined to become a long-haul truckie and two years later, he got his wish.

It was the start of an extraordinary career that spanned more than 50 years and propelled David Hay to the top levels of the Australian transport industry in major companies including TNT, Linfox, Pacific Waste, Mayne Logistics and FBT Transwest.

He won promotion early – in 1976, at the age of 32, he became the youngest general manager in the TNT group – proved to be an excellent manager and was formidably qualified, academically as well as through a lifetime of hands on experience.

In 1990, David Hay graduated from the University of Illinois, Chicago, where he majored in landfill management and in 1995, completed the senior executive program at the London Business School.

Those were the easier challenges. In his mid-20s – already married and the father of two – he completed his Diploma of Transport Management at the Queensland University of Technology while working in a day job, driving taxis at night and often studying into the early hours by torchlight.

David Hay's untimely death from cancer in June 2011 robbed the Australian supply chain industry of one its most respected and dynamic figures, but thanks to an endowment from his widow, Christine, the legacy of the truckie who inspired numerous people is assured.

In January 2012, the inaugural David Hay Scholarships were presented by the Institute for Supply Chain and Logistics, Victoria University.

The scholarships, to be offered annually to successful applicants for a range of courses from Diploma to PhD specialising in Freight, Logistics, Transport and Supply Chain.

Above all, they will serve as a lasting inspiration for the men and women who choose to advance their careers in the industry David Hay served with unflagging passion and commitment.

The David Hay Scholarship

The David Hay Scholarship is an award made available by the generosity of Christine Hay, David Hay's widow, who wishes to assist those wanting to pursue further studies in the field of Supply Chain, Logistics and Transport.

The David Hay Scholarship will fund the course fees for the successful applicant(s). Additional support may be offered as determined by the David Hay Endowment Management Committee, after having regard to all relevant factors including the individual Scholar's personal circumstances.

Preference will be given to applicants **“who aspire to advance their career in the Supply Chain, Logistics and Transport industry”**.

The David Hay Scholarship in 2013 will be offered to a range of successful applicants to study any course from Diploma to PhD specialising in Freight, Logistics, Transport and Supply Chain. The VU Foundation, through the Institute for Supply Chains and Logistics (ISCL) is managing the David Hay Scholarship. The ISCL is a specialist research and education centre providing independent, industry-focused study and development. The ISCL's key goal is to provide robust knowledge to support and deliver value to organisations, businesses and individuals operating in the supply chain industry. Each successful recipient automatically becomes an Associate of the ISCL.

Conditions of the David Hay Scholarship

1. Applicants must be an Australian citizen or a permanent resident in Australia.
2. The applicant must have the capacity to undertake study in the agreed period and abide by the rules of the David Hay Endowment Fund.
3. Successful recipient(s) must achieve satisfactory academic progress through the term of the course in which the student is enrolled.
4. The David Hay Scholarship is designed to support the person not the firm; therefore employers cannot use this scholarship as a substitute for funding professional development.
5. The David Hay Endowment Management Committee has the right to review the applicability of students if circumstances arise.
6. Successful recipient(s) will attend the Victorian Transport Association's Annual Australian Freight Industry Awards on Saturday 4 September (a black tie event) for an award presentation and a graduation ceremony to receive the David Hay Scholarship honour.
7. The David Hay Endowment Management Committee's decision is final.
