DAAD Scholarships and Funding Programs for Australia

- The German Academic Exchange Service (**DAAD**) is a joint organisation of the German **institutions of higher education**. The purpose of the DAAD is to promote relations between these German institutions and higher education institutions abroad, primarily through the **exchange** of students, academics and scientists.
- The **scholarships** offered by the DAAD are awarded to advanced excellent students, young higher education graduates and academics from all fields of science and humanities as well as from fields of music and art.
- Applicants who have been resident in Germany for longer than one year at the time of application cannot be considered. The **scholarships aim to foster exchange**.
- Please keep in mind that the selection process for most scholarships takes a long time, so **planning more than one year in advance** may be required. Check the info for your chosen scholarship programme for more details.
- You will find more detailed information on **scholarships and funding** in the database on the <u>German DAAD website</u> and on the **DAAD Sydney website**: <u>http://ic.daad.de/sydney/scholarship.htm</u>
- DAAD scholarship recipients for a stay over 6 months are entitled to a funded language course in Germany of 2 (up to 6) months before beginning their actual studies / research. Alternatively they can participate in DUO (Deutsch-Uni Online, a platform for German language courses) at no cost (registration at http://www.deutsch-uni.com/duo_webshop/portal/daad/index_en.htm).

Attending a course is usually very helpful for situations outside the study/research context as well as in making friends. Scholarship recipients who will study or conduct research **in English only** may also attend a funded language course should they wish to do so. The fact that no knowledge of German is required for their proposed study/research will not diminish their chances of receiving funding for a language course; at the same time, deciding not to participate in a course will have no negative consequences in any way.

- Scholarship holders attending university courses that are held in German are required to take an initial language test. These may be tests devised by their university (DSH) or a Goethe-Institut test (KDS, GDS) as well as the international and standardised TestDaF (www.testdaf.de)
- Detailed information on what application papers need to be submitted for each of our programs can be found on <u>our website</u>. We have prepared Application Packs for most of our programs, containing all required forms as well as extra information and a checklist..
- Please note that if you are receiving **other funds or scholarship**(s), you are obliged to note this on the application form and that these will be taken into account when deciding how much funding you will be granted. In case your current scholarship pays more than the DAAD scholarship, this may mean that you will only receive e.g. a travel allowance and health insurance, but no living allowance. However, you will still be a DAAD scholarship holder and join the ranks of DAAD alumni, including all alumni benefits!

Objective

In co-operation with the universities in Duisburg-Essen, Freiburg, Leipzig and the IIK Duesseldorf, the DAAD offers scholarships to participate in a *Deutschlandkundlicher Winterkurs*. This program is designed for Southern hemisphere students and young academics with a sound knowledge of German (level B2 or C1) and some background in German studies who are interested in improving their language skills and understanding of contemporary affairs, aiming for further (p/g) studies in Germany.

Duration Courses last 6 weeks and are offered in the German winter months.

Requirements

- excellently-qualified undergraduates, graduate students and PhD candidates in all fields who have successfully completed at least two academic years of study
- graduates in German and German academics are excluded
- knowledge of German at levels B2 / C1

Deadline (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Sydney)

15 August for stays in January/ February of the following year. You will hear about the outcome around mid-October.

Objective

In co-operation with the ASKO Europa Stiftung (AES) and other renowned partners in Germany and Australia, the DAAD offers scholarships to participate in a two-week course on a variety of issues regarding Europe and the European Union. The course is held in English.

Duration The course usually takes place in December and lasts two weeks.

Requirements

- advanced undergraduates and graduates enrolled at an Australian or New Zealand university
- applicants must be Australian or New Zealand nationals or have been living / studying in Australia / New Zealand for the last 6 years.



Deadline (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Sydney)

The deadline varies, but is usually around late August or early September. Please note that this is not a scholarship with regular funding. Availability each year will therefore depend on the availability of funding. Please contact us on <u>daad.australia@gmail.com</u> around mid-July to check whether the seminar will be held that year.

Study Scholarships for Graduates of All Disciplines

Objective

Study scholarships are awarded to provide foreign graduates of all disciplines with opportunities to complete a postgraduate or Master's degree course at a German higher education institution and to gain a degree in Germany (Master's/Diplom).

Duration 10 months: scholarships may be extended to 22 months

Requirements

- excellently-qualified graduates holding a first degree (Bachelorqs)
- a convincing presentation of the applicantos academic and personal reasons for the planned study project in Germany
- applicants should have received their last degree no longer than six years before the application deadline.

Deadline (Date of receipt at the DAAD in **Sydney**) 30 September

As this scholarship will often include a language course prior to studying, stays usually run from October the following year, with language courses to begin from April onwards. For candidates who don't require a language course (because they will be studying in English or because they already have a high level of German), stays may begin from April of the following year.

Research Grants for Doctoral Candidates, Young Academics and Scientists

Objective

Research grants provide young academics and scientists with an opportunity to carry out a research project or a course of continuing education at a German university or non-university research institute as follows

- research projects at a German university for a doctorate in the home country
- research projects or continuing education without aiming for a formal degree/qualification

Duration 1 to 12 months; 12 months scholarships may be extended up to 24 months

Requirements

- excellently-qualified graduates holding a (research) Masteros / Honoursqdegree
- a convincing and well-planned research or continuing education and training project
- applicants should have received their last degree no longer than six years before the application deadline.
- Ph.D. students should have started their Ph.D. no longer than three years before the application deadline.



 applicants with a Ph.D. applying for a long stay should have finished their Ph.D. no more than two years prior to application. Applicants with a Ph.D. applying for a short stay (up to six months) should have finished their Ph.D. no more than four years prior to application.

Deadlines (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Sydney)

- 30 September, for stays of more than six months (study stays to run from April/October of the following year; research stays to start between April and October of the following year); you will hear about the outcome around late February.
- 30 September, for short term visits of 1-6 months (stays to start between March and August of the following year); you will hear about the outcome around late January.
- 31 March, for short term visits of 1-6 months (stays to start between September of the same year and February of the following year); you will hear about the outcome around July.

Objective

These study scholarships aim to provide foreign applicants from the field of Fine Art, Design, Film, Music and Architecture as well as Drama, Direction, Dance and Choreography with an opportunity to complete a course of extension studies, without gaining a formal degree or qualification, at a German state (public) or state-recognised higher education institution.

Duration one academic year, scholarships may be extended

Requirements

- appropriate degree
- applicants should have received their last degree no longer than six years before the application deadline.

Deadline (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Sydney)

30 September (for stays to run from October of the following year) You will hear about the outcome around March.

Objective

The study visits for academics program aims to enable lecturers from the fields of Fine Art, Design, Film, Music, Architecture as well as Performing Arts (Drama, Direction, Dance, Choreography, etc.) to apply for a supported study visit for the purpose of artistic cooperation with a German host institution.

Duration

Depending on the applicant's work schedule, the study visit will last between one and three months.

Requirements

To qualify for support under the study visits for artists programme, the applicant must be lecturing at a higher education institution in the home country. A well-planned and convincing project is an important selection criterion. The application papers must be accompanied by written confirmation of academic supervision or confirmation of agreement having been reached with a German institution of higher education.

Deadlines (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Sydney)

- 30 September for stays to run from February of the following year; you will hear about the outcome around late December.



 31 March for stays to run from August of the same year; you will hear about the outcome around late June.

Please note: DAAD support for study visits by artists can only be awarded once in any three-year period.

Objective

These grants and scholarships aim to provide foreign academics and scientists working in higher education or at research institutes with an opportunity to carry out a research project at a state (public) or state-recognised higher education institution or non-university research institute in Germany.

Duration 1 to 3 months

Requirements

- excellently-qualified academics and scientists holding a PhD and working in higher education or at a research institute in their home country.
- a convincing and well-planned research project

Deadlines (Date of receipt at the DAAD in **Sydney**)

- 30 September for stays to run from February of the following year; you will hear about the outcome around late December.
- 31 March for stays to run from August of the same year; you will hear about the outcome around late June.

Re-invitation Program for Former Scholarship Holders

Objective

Former scholarship holders of scholarships from 6 months upwards may apply for re-invitation to Germany to complete a research or work project at a state (public) or state-recognised higher education institution or non-university research institute.

Duration 1 to 3 months

Requirements

- well-planned research or work project to be completed during the stay in Germany
- proof of a workplace being provided at the host institute
- support for a re-invitation can only be awarded once in any three-year period

Deadlines (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Sydney)

- 30 September for stays to run from February of the following year; you will hear about the outcome around late December.
- 31 March for stays to run from August of the same year; you will hear about the outcome around late June.

Objective

The program aims to

- provide students with subject-related knowledge by arranging appropriate visits, tours and information meetings (Study Visits) or by organising subject-related seminars and practical courses
- give students a greater understanding of and insight (regional and area studies) into economic, political and cultural life in Germany.

Duration 7 to 12 days

Requirements

- groups of students who are fully matriculated in their third semester or higher in a relevant degree program and under the guidance of a lecturer
- 10 to 15 persons, + 1 accompanying lecturer

Deadlines (Date of receipt at the DAAD in Bonn)

1 November for trips to commence from 1st of March (DAAD decision made around mid-January)

1 February for trips to commence from 1st of June (DAAD decision made around early April)

1 May for trips to commence from 1st of September (DAAD decision made around early July)

Other Scholarship Programs

Objective and Requirements

If you are an Australian citizen and not a native German speaker, have an excellent IB or Australian Higher Education Certificate, know German at or near-university level and are planning to do your university degree in Germany, you might be eligible for one of 120 scholarships available worldwide for gifted graduates of German and equivalent schools.

Duration Scholarships are intended for up to 5 years (Bachelor and Master), under certain circumstances up to 8 years incl. a PhD.

Deadline (Date of receipt at the DAAD Sydney): 30 January

RISE worldwide E Research Internships in Science and Engineering for German Bachelor Students

Objectives and Requirements

Research groups, laboratories and doctoral students can apply to host a motivated and well-qualified student from Germany as a research intern to assist in research and lab work in the fields of biology, chemistry, physics, earth sciences, engineering, or a closely related field. Interns receive a DAAD



scholarship consisting of a monthly allowance, a travel subsidy as well as health, accident and personal liability insurance.

Researchers from accredited universities and non-profit research institutions submit project offers online. The DAAD posts these offers in a database on its website. German applicants then apply for the projects from December through mid-January. The prospective hosts are asked to provide DAAD with a list ranking the most qualified applicants. The DAAD makes its final decisions on the basis of these lists, the academic credentials of the students, and the demand for a given project, and notifies successful hosts and students in March.

Duration 6 weeks to 3 months; earliest starting date: 1 June, 2012

Deadline (Submission of project proposals): 10 October 2011 through 27 November 2011

DAAD-Go8 program for researchers

Group of Eight Australia Ë Germany Joint Research Co-operation Scheme

Objective

The scheme aims to

- foster research collaborations between Australian researchers from Go8 universities and German researchers by supporting exchanges between Australian and German researchers
- result in research outcomes and the exchange of skills and knowledge of mutual benefit to Australia and Germany.

Requirements

- Applicants must be Australian citizens or Australian permanent residents
- Applicants must be employed as academic staff members in a teaching and research or research only role or a PhD student involved in the research project submitted by an eligible staff member at a Go8 university (ANU, UoAdelaide, UoMelbourne, Monash University, UNSW, UQ, USYD, UWA)
- Well-defined research proposals necessitating research collaboration between Australian and German researchers
- Preference for projects that facilitate exchanges between early career researchers
- The DAAD particularly welcomes applications in the natural and engineering sciences

Deadline

Applications for exchanges usually open in **April** each year.

Please note: To be successful, Australian applicants must ensure that their German collaborators submit a corresponding application with the same title to the DAAD in Germany!

DAAD-ATN program for researchers

ATN-DAAD Australia Germany Joint Research Cooperation Scheme

The scheme is a joint initiative of the **Australian Technology Network of Universities** (**ATN**: QUT, UTS, RMIT, UniSA, Curtin University) and the DAAD for an initial period of three years.

Objective

The scheme aims to

- foster research collaboration of the highest quality between Australian researchers from ATN universities and German researchers from German universities, institutes of technology and Fachhochschulen (Fachhochschulen are German higher education institutions that offer applied research and practical courses of study).
- support exchanges for Australian researchers to spend time at partner institutions in Germany and for collaborating German researchers to spend time at ATN universities.
- It is hoped that the scheme will result in research outcomes and the exchange of skills and knowledge of mutual benefit to Australia and Germany.

Requirements

- Applicants must be Australian citizens or hold permanent residence status in Australia and be employed as an academic staff member in a teaching and research or research only role at an ATN university.
- Particular preference will be given to projects that facilitate exchanges between early career researchers involved in research collaborations of mutual benefit to Australia and Germany.
- The criteria to be used in assessing Australian applications include:
- the quality of the research project;
- the experience and track record of the participating researchers/research groups;
- the level of involvement of early career researchers; and
- the potential of the project to result in outcomes of mutual benefit to Australia and Germany.

Deadline

The initial call for applications opened on 1 October 2010 and will **close on 23 December**. One signed application must be submitted to the contact officer in the relevant ATN Research Office, with an electronic version of the application also submitted by email.

Please note: To be successful, Australian applicants must ensure that their German collaborators submit a corresponding application with the same title to the DAAD in Germany!

In addition to the monthly grant, an apartment, workspace (studio) and funds for projects relating to Berlin are provided.

The DAAD advertises the program and runs two-month German language courses for the fellows. Also, all Leibniz-DAAD Research Fellows enjoy the general support measures of the DAAD for grant-holders and alumni.

Requirements

The Leibniz-DAAD Research Fellowship Program is open to qualified post-docs from all over the world who have completed their doctorate not longer than two years ago.

Deadline June 20, 2011; currently no offers available.

Erasmus Mundus

Objective

Erasmus Mundus allows talented students from outside the EU to undertake Master's degrees in Europe. In the jargon of the EU these students are "third country students". Australians fall into this category and thus are eligible for the opportunities Erasmus Mundus offers. Erasmus Mundus Master's degrees are co-ordinated between different EU and Norwegian higher education institutions so that you do parts of the course in different universities, fully or partly in different countries.

COST exists to foster cooperation between nationally-funded research activities. COST offers Travel Scholarships of "2,500 (ca. AUD 3,800) to support travel and living expenses for Australians going to Europe.

Duration Short stays, meetings, workshops etc.

Requirements

Scientists should work in one of the following five fields: medical and health research, agriculture, biotechnology and food technology, nanotechnology, information and communication technology, environment and climate change.

European program for or academics and students

EU: Industrialised Countries Instrument Education Cooperation Program (ICI ECP)

The European Commission has launched together with the governments of Australia, Japan, New Zealand and the Republic of Korea (in alphabetical order) a new multi-country call for proposals.

Objective - support international curriculum development projects that involve short term mobility between the EU and the partner ICI countries not necessarily related to award of a joint or dual/double degree.

Consortia applying for projects under this call are formed by at least 3 institutions from the EU and 2 institutions from a given partner country. Selected consortia will set up a framework for student mobility whereby EU students will typically spend one semester in the partner country institution and vice versa with full recognition of the study period abroad by the home institution. Support includes mobility grants for students and members of the academic and administrative staff (%aculty+).

Funding The EU budget finances projects with up to 2.5 million Euros. Partner countries as Australia fund common projects with a comparable amount.

Deadline for submissions of applications: usually in September.

Each year, the Australian Academy of Science invites nominations from young Australian scientists, preferably in the final years of their PhD, to attend the Meeting of Nobel Laureates in Lindau, Germany. Successful candidates will receive a travel grant from the Academy of up to \$AUD 2,000 toward travel costs to Lindau. Accommodation and registration costs will be covered by the Council for Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings.

The meetings usually take place between late June and early July. The application deadline is usually in late October.

The program enables Queenslanders to undertake collaborative scientific research or policy development projects at leading international institutions, government agencies and/or private sector research organisations. The program gives at least 12 researchers per year the opportunity to work overseas and undertake a high quality, technically feasible and strategically valuable project with a leading international knowledge partner.

Details:

Applications open around September and close in December, with results usually available from March of the following year. Eligible research areas and target countries change every round. Please check the website for further information. However, applications that identify an opportunity to collaborate with a leading knowledge partner in a country or area not listed might also be eligible for support.

Applications are assessed competitively against a number of selection criteria. Fellows must spend a minimum of 12 weeks with their international host. Up to A\$44,000 will be awarded per fellowship. The amount depends on the project duration.
