2022 KIRBY CONTRACT MOOT CLARIFICATIONS 29 JULY 2022

A. Errors

- 1. Paragraph 1 of the Joint Referral to Arbitration should provide that the date of the Agreement was 3 March 2020, not 28 March 2020.
- 2. Paragraph 7 of the Expert Determination should say "February 2020", not "February 2022".
- 3. Paragraph 20.1 of the Expert Determination should be "\$42,000", not "\$32,000".

B. Clarifications

- 4. Parties should address each of the three claims made by FDC and the counterclaim made by APM. Parties should not introduce additional heads of damages.
- 5. Parties should not contend for a collateral contract.
- 6. APM did not give FDC notice of an intention to terminate the Agreement.
- The MPE produced bottles of 135mL capacity. The bottles were full of Old Smokey (holding 135mL) when delivered by FDC, as described in paragraph 21 of the Expert Determination.
- 8. The capacity of the bottles produced by the MPE was not tested after it was installed at FDC's premises.
- 9. Parties may assume that a breach of the implied term by APM was sufficient to enliven a right for FDC to terminate the Agreement.
- 10. Parties may assume that the high concentration of alcohol alone caused the PET to disintegrate in the manner described in paragraph 23 of the Expert Determination.
- 11. Parties may assume that supplying PET in pellets (as opposed to another form) was not, of itself, relevant to any defects in the bottles produced by the MPE.
- 12. The \$5,000 referred to in cl 6.3 of the Agreement was inserted by APM. APM did not provide evidence of the of its calculation or selection of that amount.

- 13. Parties may assume that, during the conversation referred to in paragraphs 8 and 9 of the Expert Determination, Ms Swanson told Mr Adams that FDC intended to bottle hand sanitiser comprised of not less than 80% alcohol. During that conversation, Mr Adams suggested the MPE as the appropriate piece of equipment and stated that it employed the kind of PET plastic which was in fact supplied.
- 14. Parties may assume that the MPE was delivered and installed with a fixed mould for the bottles, which FDC could not and did not alter.
