COMMON TYPES OF COLLABORATION BETWEEN RESEARCH ORGANISATIONS

Broad academic collaboration – formalise a relationship with the intention of fostering collaboration for mutual benefit through joint research, staff mobility and/or cooperation on research and research training.

Joint coursework degree – a single program taught by Victoria University and one or more partner tertiary institutions that is jointly approved and collaboratively developed and delivered.

Jointly awarded PhD – a pre-approved, jointly supervised research training program leading to a single doctoral degree awarded jointly by Victoria University and another institution.

Dual degree – two programs undertaken at two separate institutions that can be packaged together with formal pre-approved cross-credit to enable students to gain two qualifications.

Cotutelle (Split-site PhD) – PhD students to be supervised jointly by academics from different universities.

Research project or program – Project level collaboration often through a formal agreed or documented expectation.
