

- **OSRC quarterly meetings:** Quarterly online meetings resumed to reconnect the network (85 centres), share updates, and encourage collaboration.
 - **Format:** 3–4 meetings per year with rotating themes and formats focused on updates and knowledge exchange.
 - **Network:** 85 centres across 28 countries; meetings support onboarding and cross-centre connections.
 - **Next steps:** Analyse centre reports, circulate a survey on expectations, and plan toward the 2028 OSRC Colloquium.
- **International Olympic Case Study Competition:** In-person finals held in Lausanne; next edition open for registration (theme: LA28 and five new sports).
 - **Finals:** 10 universities participated; programme included visits to Olympic House and the International Volleyball Federation.
 - **Registration:** Centres are encouraged to mobilise universities, especially from underrepresented regions.
 - **Academic partners:** Universidad Europea de Madrid (undergraduate) and Johannes Gutenberg University of Mainz (masters).
 - **Teaching resources:** Previous case studies are available online for use in teaching; centres can contribute additional material.
- **OSC grant programmes:** Updates on PhD, Early Career, and Advanced grants, plus support for the International Olympic Academy (IOA) postgraduate seminar.
 - **PhD & Early Career:** 54 applicants from 26 countries for 2026; next (2027) call to launch soon; network members support selection.
 - **Advanced Grant:** Supports consortium-based projects; 2027–2029 call opens in October with priority fields aligned with the IOC.
 - **IOA seminar:** Annual postgraduate seminar in Olympia; six tuition grants for candidates supported by OSRCs (application/funding details shared).
- **Olympic World Library:** Free, comprehensive digital resource for Olympic research and teaching; enhancements underway (digitisation and educational pages).
 - **Content:** 42,000+ items including publications, e-documents, and historical archives; supports research, teaching, and loans.

- **Access/support:** Freely accessible without registration; online presentations/training can be offered on request.
- **Enhancements:** Digitised collections by Games edition and new educational pages (more in next meeting).
- **Milano-Cortina 2026: centre activities:** Five centres shared research and engagement initiatives linked to the Winter Games.
 - **AISTS (Switzerland):** Instagram follower growth study for 163 Swiss athletes; patterns tied to team accounts, performance, and sport culture.
 - **Victoria University (Australia):** Collaborative research comparing Milan 1956 vs 2026, media engagement, and ethics-related guest presentations.
 - **Fuzhou University (China):** Sports-law case analysis (jurisdiction scrutiny, eligibility disputes, expressive behaviour); invitation to collaborate on a shared arbitration-case platform.
 - **Scottish Centre (UK):** Research on inclusivity and peace promotion; call for collaboration and papers on media representation and cultural politics.
 - **University of Oregon (USA):** Olympic Studies Week with online panels, guest speakers, campus events, and cross-centre collaboration during the Games.
- **Network collaboration:** Ideas to improve collaboration include sharing centres' research interests, organising thematic groups, and increasing transparency of expertise across the network.
 - **Practical options:** Maintain an expertise/research-interest register to enable targeted partnerships.
 - **Communication:** Use existing mailing lists and direct centre-to-centre contact; clarify what is network-only vs broader communications.
 - **Balance:** Thematic grouping can help focus collaboration but should not fragment the network; clear expertise descriptions are key.
- **Olympic Day coordination:** Proposal to coordinate centre activities via a rolling calendar, including digital/live-stream elements; toolkits support the “Let’s Move” campaign.
