








Strong growth in global food demand Moderate growth in food prices to 2050




Most of the food consumption growth is expected to happen in Asia

Australia (and Victoria) supplies the food that Asia wants


Real value by commodity group


Australia is now a relatively high cost producer: transformational change is required to take advantage of the Asian century
