Research Masters Information:

Application, Courses, Mapping your Degree

Entry requirements to all Research Masters courses:

1. Minimum of a bachelor degree with a distinction average in the final year (minimum of 70%), or equivalent qualification and professional experience, demonstrating your capacity to undertake a Masters by Research.
2. You must also demonstrate English competency sufficient for study at Masters level
 - Previous degree/s in English(within the last two years)
 - an overall band score of not less than 6.5 in an International English Language Testing Service (IELTS) test with no individual band score below 6.0
 - a score of not less than 92 with no section score less than 22 in Teaching of English Foreign Language (TOEFL) test, or English proficiency equivalent
 - other documented proof of English proficiency equivalent to the above

VU Research Masters courses:

To provide students with flexibility, VU has devised three Research Masters courses of different durations and with different combinations of coursework depending on your background. Your admission into a particular Research Masters course will be determined by the Research Institute in your area. This decision will be based on: your level of qualification and the relationship between your previous study; and your proposed Masters research (i.e. whether or your previous study is in an area deemed to be cognate (related) with your proposed research).

You will be supported in this pre Confirmation of Candidature period by the concurrent structures of a) working with your supervisor on your research project and b) by building research skills and refining that project in the context of the coursework units.

1. Master of Research

- **Duration:** 1.5 years
- **Requirements:** *either*
 - AQF 7 qualification (Bachelors) in a cognate discipline, *or*
 - AQF 8 qualification (Honours or equivalent) in a non-cognate discipline
- **Components:**
 - Research project documented in a thesis of 25,000-50,000 words
 - 3 coursework units
 - Two units are core units – research-based
 - One unit is ‘flexible’ – discipline-based or research-based (depending on entry point)

2. Master of Applied Research

- **Duration:** 2.0 years
- **Requirements:** AF7 qualification (Bachelors) in a non-cognate discipline
- **Components:**
 - Research project documented in a thesis of 25,000-50,000 words
 - 4 coursework units
 - Three units are research-based
 - One ‘flexible’ unit – discipline-based

3. Master of Research Practice

- **Duration:** 1.0 year
- **Requirements:** AQF 8 qualification (Honours or equivalent) in a cognate discipline
- **Components:**
 - Research project documented in a thesis of 25,000-50,000 words
 - 2 core coursework units, research-based

Please check that you receive your personalised Student Map at the point of enrolment – this will map out the coursework you will take in your particular pathway

1. HDR Researcher Integrity Module

In this first phase of your degree – known as the pre-Confirmation of Candidature period - you are required to undertake 3-4 self-paced online modules. These HDR Researcher Integrity modules will give you a broad-brush introduction to some of the protocols and expectations around the vital questions of integrity and ethical conduct within research work and will no doubt prompt questions for you about the undertaking of your own project; please make a note of your ideas and queries and bring them to the coursework unit to discuss in a collegial and interdisciplinary context (UGR7003 Research Integrity and Ethics, see timetable, p. 9). The core units will provide you with the opportunity to build upon the topics touched on in these modules, enabling you to gain insight into how you – as well as other students – will undertake research in a professional, constructive and transparent manner.

The HDR Researcher Integrity Modules can be located on [VU Collaborate](#), under the Support and Collaborate tab (please note your enrolment will need to be processed before you have access to this space). The modules will take you approximately half an hour each and you will need to gain at least 80% in the quiz to have the module register as completed. You may like to discuss some of the content with your supervisor whom you should be making contact with during this initial phase. Here also is a Help Guide to [Navigating VU Collaborate](#).

There are up to 4 modules which are appropriate for you to complete in the pre Confirmation of Candidature period (ie approx. the first 6 months f/t; 12 months p/t). All commencing HDR students *must* complete the following three modules:

- 1. The Responsible Conduct of Research**
 - 3. Planning your Research**
 - 4. Managing and Recording your Research**

10. Responsible Conduct of Human Participants Research (if applicable) *or*
 11. The Care and Use of Animals in Research (if applicable)

You should **complete at least modules 1 and 3 before the commencement of coursework**. You will also be able to refer back to them in the course of your research degree.

NB: You will be required to have completed the above three core modules (plus any additional relevant modules) in order to present for Confirmation of Candidature.

2. Coursework Units

NB: IN S1 2023, ALL CLASSES DELIVERED IN PERSON P134 FOOTSCRAY PARK CAMPUS (unless otherwise directed)

Students in all three master of Research courses will study the following two core units to support them in their transition into a research pathway:

- 1. UGR7002 Research Design and Proposal Development:** This unit will explicitly help you to 'put together the pieces' of your research: your research question, its position within existing knowledge, your related choices about methodology and prepare for you Confirmation of Candidature.
- 2. UGR7003 Research Integrity and Ethics:** This unit gives an overview of the general and specific ways in which research must be undertaken with integrity, asking you to consider the ethical implications for your project.

Depending on your course and your background, you may also be required to take the following units:

- 3. UGR7001 Introduction to Research Methodology:** This unit provides an oversight of some of the most common research methodologies, considering why they might be selected and what particular methods they might involve, *and/or*
- 4. UGR7006 Enhancing Researcher Knowledge and Skills:** This is a 'shell unit,' which allows supervisors and students to build a customised unit of learning to meet the disciplinary needs of the student. It may involve auditing an existing unit (AQF 8-10) in your discipline, or working to a customised study program devised by your supervisor. It might be that you undertake a unit that is already being offered by Victoria University which you 'audit'. NB: You don't get a mark for that unit; you get a mark for UGR7006 Enhancing Researcher Knowledge and Skills.

Master of Research Fees

Because this is a research degree, there are no tuition fees for local students - if you complete your degree within the prescribed time frame

NB: All domestic students pay a Student Amenities Fee (approx. \$300 per year EFT)

- **Entry Requirement:** *Either*
 - A: AQF 7 (Bachelors) in a cognate discipline 70% min average in final year, *or*
 - B: AQF 8 (honours or equivalent) in a non-cognate discipline 70% min average in final year
- **Components:**
 - Research project documented in a thesis of 25,000-50,000 words + *either*
 - 3 research-based units, *or*
 - 2 research-based units + 1 discipline-based 'shell' unit
