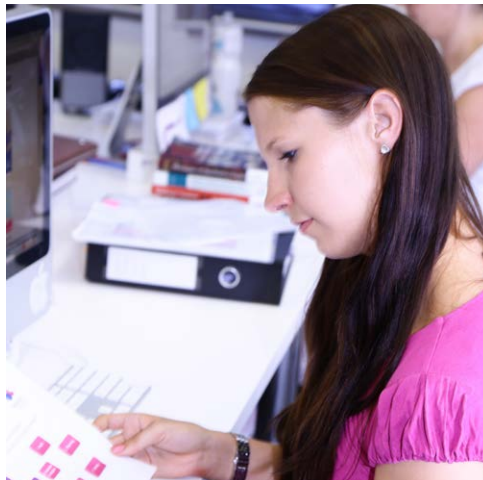
ARTS



BACHELOR OF SCREEN MEDIA – ABSN

Students will graduate ready for a career as a critically informed media professional with the skills to deliver innovative media content across existing and emerging platforms. Through hands-on activities, they will be encouraged to reflect upon and develop skills in media production for online distribution, video-on-demand, and use of streaming sites such as YouTube, television, and radio. Your students may also be eligible for the Westpac Foundation scholarship, offered to two first-year technology undergraduates.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a minimum study score of 20 in English (any) or 25 English (EAL).



BACHELOR OF MARKETING COMMUNICATION – ABMM

The Bachelor of Marketing Communication has been developed in collaboration with industry leaders to ensure current and emerging trends are an integral component of the curriculum. VU's Student-led Communication Agency at MetroWest will give students the opportunity to put their theory into practice by working with real clients and on real projects. Graduates will be job-ready for roles in public relations, publicity, sponsorship, media management, publishing, digital engagement, consumer behaviour, account management and more.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a minimum study score of 20 in English (any) or 25 English (EAL).



BACHELOR OF PROFESSIONAL AND CREATIVE WRITING – ABWR

This course develops students' ability to become media-fluid, working across traditional print as well as digital platforms, social media, idea generation and content delivery. Career options include author, publisher, speechwriter, copywriter, editor, policy writer, technical writer, content creator/developer, social media content producer and more.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a minimum study score of 20 in English (any) or 25 English (EAL).

BACHELOR OF LAWS / BACHELOR OF PSYCHOLOGICAL STUDIES - LBWP

This double degree equips graduates with a law qualification and a better understanding of themselves, their clients and colleagues. They will enjoy enhanced employability in occupations where there is an interaction between the law, psychology and mental health, from courtrooms to community centres. It provides a global and social justice perspective and an understanding of human behaviour, motivation, relationships, communication and cognitive processes.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a minimum study score of 25 in English (any) or 30 in English (EAL).



BACHELOR OF LAWS (HONOURS) / BACHELOR OF PSYCHOLOGY (HONOURS) - LHWP

VU offers the only Bachelor of Laws (Honours)/ Bachelor of Psychology (Honours) double degree in Victoria. Upon graduating, students will meet requirements for Provisional Registration as a Provisional Psychologist, associate membership of the Australian Psychological Society (APS) and for admittance as an Australian lawyer in Victoria. Students may exit the course after five years with an accredited Bachelor of Psychological Studies if the relevant units have been completed.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a minimum study score of 25 in English (any) or 30 English (EAL).

ENGINEERING AND SCIENCE



BACHELOR OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY — NBIT

With a contemporary focus across all aspects of information technology, this course equips students with hands-on skills and an understanding of the current and predicted key growth areas in IT, including web and mobile application development, and network and system computing. Graduates can work in a range of roles, from software analysis to web or app design, consultancy and systems administration.

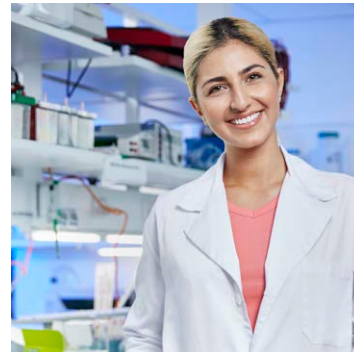
Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a study score of at least 20 in English (any) or 25 English (EAL), and 20 in Mathematics (any).



BACHELOR OF BUILDING (CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT) — NBBC

Develop the skills to manage all aspects of the construction process. Graduates can enter the private and public sectors undertaking work as a construction manager, project manager, quantity surveyor, building technician, estimator, facilities manager and more.

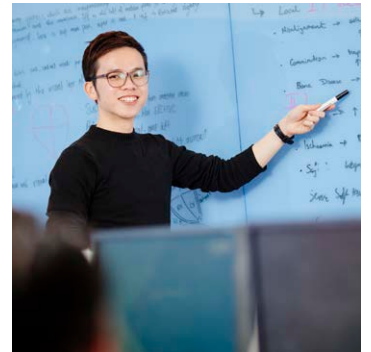
Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a study score of at least 20 in English (any) or 25 English (EAL).



BACHELOR OF PHARMACEUTICAL HEALTH SCIENCE — NBPH

With a focus on hands-on training in the complementary areas of pharmaceutical and health sciences, this course is ideal for those with an interest in combining health studies with chemistry studies to achieve employment in roles such as pharmaceutical scientist, analytical chemist and forensic scientist. Career options span the health, pharmaceutical and chemical industries.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a study score of at least 25 in English (any) or at least 30 in English (EAL); at least 25 in Chemistry; and at least 25 in Biology or Health and Human Development.



BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (SCIENCE FOR TEACHING) — NBAS

Students will gain a solid foundation in science and/or maths for science-based professions, with a seamless pathway to our Master of Teaching (Secondary). The broad and flexible course structure enables students to gain an in-depth knowledge of their chosen field prior to embarking on an education pathway if they choose.

Prerequisites: VCE or equivalent with a study score of at least 20 in English (any), or 25 English (EAL), and at least 20 in a mathematics (any).
