


THE **NEW WAY** TO DO UNI

Over 90% of Australian adults are interested in sport with 8.4 million adults and 3 million Aussie kids participating in sport every year.

According to the <u>Australian Industry and Skills Committee</u>, they estimate that 60,000 people are directly employed in the Sport Sector, with a projected increase of 16% by 2024 (once we are COVID free).

VU is ranked No.12 in the world for Sports Science and we have <u>many courses</u> available to suit people's passions, with over <u>200 partnerships and affiliations</u> to help kick-start careers in the industry.

At VU we are committed to creating <u>no boundaries for women and girls in sports</u>. Each year, one student will receive a <u>Women in Sport Scholarship</u> which goes towards studies in sport at Victoria University.

We are also committed to supporting elite sportspeople with our <u>Elite student athletes</u> <u>program</u> where students can receive an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards our ATAR courses.

VU Polytechnic – Demand for health industry professionals


