VU Research Fellowship 2023: Education top-up guidelines

The **Opportunity**

Summary

VU RISE, through VU Research Fellowships 2023,, is offering a top-up research allocation for research related to education. VU RISE is funded by the Victorian State Government as part of its Victorian Higher Education State Investment Fund (VHESIF).

Top ups will be on top of any base research allocation (via the normal process), and up to an additional 0.2FTE in 2023, though normally not exceeding 0.1FTE for academics with a base research allocation.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the applicant must be eligible for a VU Research Fellowship in 2023¹ and have a demonstrable track record in education research. This includes current recipients of multi-year VU Research Fellowships in 2023 and applicants for a VU Research Fellowship in 2023.

Selection criteria

- 1. Track record and capability in education-related research (50%)
- a. What track record does the applicant have in education research
- 2. Education research capability development (25%)
 - a. How will the top-up be used to build education research capability at $\ensuremath{\mathsf{VU}}$
- 3. Pathway to impact of proposed research (25%)
 - a. What is the likely impact of the research beyond academia, and how feasible is this?

Process

All applications must be made via SmartyGrants. (See Process below).

An additional form will be attached to your current application forms, with targeted questions (See below). Attaching it to the current form avoids need for duplicate info (eg name, college, institute....)

Due date

Applications for the Education Research Top-Up are due **midnight Tuesday 20 September** (two days after main round applications are due).

VU Research Fellowship 2023 main round applicants

Results announcement

Results will be announced at the same time as for the VU Research Fellowship 2023 main round, by 29 October 2022.

Appeals

Appeals follow the same process as for VU Research Fellowships: they are possible only on process, within 14 days of results being announced and using the dedicated form available at the <u>VU Research Fellowships</u> <u>website</u>
