DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION FOR RESILIENCE



The visitor economy has been dramatically impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, creating long-term change and disruption to industry operations. To support industry recovery and resilience, this project will foster international collaboration by hosting three webinars that engage industry, community, government and education stakeholders in Australia, Malaysia, Thailand, Vietnam and Indonesia, together with other ASEAN countries.

The webinars will be a platform to share knowledge on how to build a 'new normal' for the visitor economy supply chain, and how stronger leadership and digital transformation can support supply chain resilience. The project is funded by Australia-ASEAN Council, Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade Australian Government and led by a team of researchers from Victoria University, Melbourne.

Webinar 2 is to be held on 24th Nov, 2022 and will explore: "Digital Transformation for Resilience in the Visitor Economy Supply Chain". Expert speakers will discuss the opportunities and challenges for digital transformation tools in tourism, transport, hospitality, foods and events etc. to support recovery and resilience in the industry.

### From Malaysia - Professor Chang Kah Loon

#### Topic: "Flexibility is the keyword for survival."

Prof. Logistician Chang Kah Loon FCILT, FLogM, or better known as Prof. Chang, is a senior logistician, transport planner, and professor of practice (logistics) in Malaysia, who has been in practice in logistics since 1994. Having received his education at Chung Hwa Confucian Schools, the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport, Universiti Sains Malaysia, and the University of Bolton, respectively, Prof. Chang is the President of the Society of Logisticians, Malaysia (LogM), the Chairman of the CILT (Penang Section), a Director of AK Shipping, and the Chief Executive of AK Academy. Additionally, he sits on various advisory boards and committees of government and non-government organisations, including ministries, universities, professional bodies, and trade associations.



### From Malaysia - Professor Ts Dr Angela Lee Siew Hoong

Angela is a Professor and Head of the Department of Computing and Information Systems at School of Engineering and Technology, Sunway University, Malaysia. Angela has been developing data science curriculum since 2009. Angela is the key person to introduce the Analytics and Data Science degree at Sunway University. She was recognized by the SAS Institute as the 2021's 'Distinguished Analytics Educator of the Year'. She regularly speaks at data science conferences. Angela has developed many innovative ways to use analytics and data science tools from the most elementary level to advanced analytics. She teaches Social Media Analytics, Visual Analytics, Advanced Analytics and Business Intelligence and has authored many published international journals in the area of churn analytics, sentiment analysis and predictive analytics.

Professor Nicholas Farrelly is Head of Social Sciences at the University of Tasmania where he leads a vibrant, multi-disciplinary academic team.
